
The next research came from Mandasari (2020) this research is entitled about The Impact Of Online Learning Toward Students' Academic Performance On Business Correspondence Course. This study aims to identify the impact of online learning on student academic performance in the Business Correspondence course. As for the participation, there were 40 students consisting of (14 male and 26 female) who took the course. In this research, the method used is qualitative method by collecting data from questionnaires that have been distributed to students. From the results of the study, it was found that online learning had a positive effect on students' academic performance in terms of learning motivation, learning achievement and learning engagement (Mandasari & Wahyudin, 2019; Sari et al., 2013; Wahyudin & Sari, 2018). 
RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In the first table we can see the results of the questions, using power point media can be improved students reading skills.




And in the respondents' answers, they agree, in other words, almost of them think that using power point media can improve their reading skills.






